We have to say that these are the best pancakes we've ever made. The pancakes are fluffy, golden and light, and adding blueberries makes them deliciously interesting without being overly sweet. Simple but not boring.

| ½ cup flour | 1 egg |
| ½ cup cornmeal | 1 cup buttermilk |
| 1 teaspoon baking powder | 2 tablespoon vegetable oil |
| ½ teaspoon baking soda | 2 tablespoon sugar |
| ½ teaspoon cinnamon | 1 cup blueberries |

Sift together cornmeal, flour, baking soda, and cinnamon in medium bowl. In a smaller bowl, stir together sugar, oil, egg, and buttermilk. Add to dry ingredients to wet ingredients. Let batter stand for 15 minutes to soften cornmeal. Pour batter onto hot, buttered, griddle or pan, and sprinkle with blueberries. Turn when tops are bubbly.

Serve warm with butter and maple syrup.

The more thawed the blueberries — the more blue you're pancake will be. The blue-er the better!
